SUBJECT: ALERT TO DISTRICTS AND SCHOOLS ON THE OUTBREAK OF

HAND, FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE

DATE : 25 FEBRUARY 2025

- The outbreak of Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD) has been reported in educational institutions of KwaZulu Natal (Ethekwini District) and Eastern Cape (Buffalo City Municipality) provinces, particularly in primary schools and daycare centres/ crèches.
- 2. The hand, foot and mouth disease is a contagious viral infection that commonly affects infants and children under 10 years of age.
- 3. It is characterised by fever, feeling unwell, loss of appetite, mouth sores, and a rash on the hands, feet, and sometimes buttocks. Symptoms usually start 3 to 7 days after infection and last 7 to 10 days.
- 4. There is no specific treatment for HFMD, but it usually clears up in 7 to 10 days. HFMD is usually diagnosed clinically based on symptoms.

- 5. Principals, educators and parents should encourage good hygiene practices such as:
 - 5.1 Washing of hands with soap regularly,
 - 5.2 Cleaning and disinfecting surfaces, and
 - 5.3 Avoiding close contact with others.
- 6. Principals are advised to contact the Department of Health institutions/health centres when there are suspected or confirmed cases of HFMD. Reference should also be made to the Department of Basic Education (DBE) Circular No S3 of 2025 (attached) which guides schools on HFMD.
- 7. Children found to be affected with HFMD should not be excluded from school if they are well enough to attend, and there is no indication to close schools or restrict attendance when cases arise.
